<b>Environmental exposure</b>	<b>Likely bacterial pathogens</b>
Saltwater fish, shellfish, poultry, meat, hides	<i>Erysipelothrix rhusiopathiae</i>
Saltwater or brackish water exposure	<i>Vibrio</i> species ( <i>V. vulnificus</i> , <i>V. alginolyticus</i> , non-O1 <i>V. cholera</i> , <i>V. parahaemolyticus</i> )
Fresh water exposure	<i>Aeromonas hydrophilia</i> , <i>Pseudomonas aeruginosa</i> , <i>Edwardsiella tarda</i>
Cat bites / saliva	<i>Pasteurella multocida</i> , anerobes, human skin flora (staphylococci)
Dog bites / saliva	<i>Capnocytophaga canimorsus</i> , <i>Pasteurella multocida</i> , anerobes, human skin flora (staphylococci)
